The status of our project in brief



We were recently blessed to have one of Perth's best machine shops offer to support us with the fabrication of several components needed to get our car completed and on wheels.

Our good friend Leon Eversfield from Aeromechanics in Wales is waiting on data from our front suspension to compile a FEA analysis, our crew members Mike Annear and Lorenzo Mattaboni are still working on gathering this information. We are still eagerly waiting on a visit by John "Ackers" Ackroyd to cross check some of cars performance and handling characteristics, in particular her changing centre of gravity under power and yaw moments created with propellant sloshing.

Ackers is presently working on a special feature presentation for the Delhi Commonwealth Games, he promises to visit us after this event.

We are still waiting on an engineering report to establish the top-hat skin attachment design, we intend to screw and glue these sheets in place but must leave the option to have them removable until our camera gear and computer boxes are positioned.



Our composite windshield construction is currently underway thanks to Robb at Hybrid Customs In Perth; these guys do some amazing composite creations for the race car industry.

We are also in discussions with a leading Perth Tooling Company who can create our nose plug out of a foam block using a CNC Robot mill, boy this will make the crew happy not having to rub back and sand to build this out of body filler.



Our good friends at Loco TV have nearly completed a 10 minute promotional DVD to help educate and inform potential sponsors of the great opportunities that exist with our project. Hopefully we can put this up on our website very soon.

With other contenders in the race to break the land speed record and move on to 1000 mph, it does mean that there is the potential to raise the record many times over the next few years and the exposure for sponsors will be global and could last several years.

Bob's contribution to the US rocket development program was huge and he was a pioneer in his field.
